Finally, this month's rules check. It's the plugged or embedded ball – particularly relevant in the current damp conditions. A ball is plugged if it lies in it's own pitch mark and part of the ball is below the surface of the ground (note not the grass) If you find yourself in this unfortunate situation this is what you do. If you're in the General Area of the course, mark the position of the ball, pick a spot just behind the ball (not nearer the hole) as the reference point. Then drop your ball in a semi-circular area, radius 1 club length from the reference point. If, however you're on the green, mark your ball,

repair the pitch mark you're in and replace your ball. Note it must be your pitch mark, so guys make sure you repair all pitch marks on the green or you might not get free relief! As usual there is no relief from a ball embedded in a penalty area. Check out Rule 16.3 for further wrinkles.

Mind the Gap or Why Length Matters

Following on from last month's thoughts, this month's bit of advice is "Know Your Distances". When was the last time you did a gapping session with all of your clubs? I suspect it may be a while ago, if at all!

Carrying out this exercise will give you a better idea of the

AVERAGE distance you currently hit each club both for carry and total distance (includes roll out). It will also give you how far left and right you spray your balls and therefore inform

club selection/choice. Go and book a session on Peter the Pro's simulator. Make sure you use your normal ball

for the test.

And also remember that in the current soggy wintry conditions take something off your normal distances as the ball will not fly or roll as far.
